8.3 Debate on the following 2019/2020 DA motion:

**This House notes:**

That nationally the country has missed out on creating 43 700 job opportunities over the past four years due to insufficient investment into research, development and innovation in the agricultural sector; and

That research has the potential to make the agricultural sector in KwaZulu-Natal more competitive, more resilient and more efficient.

**This House therefore resolves:**

To increase our provincial focus on research and development into the agricultural sector, as a strategic area, in line with the move towards the 4<sup>th</sup> industrial revolution and implementation of President Ramaphosa's economic recovery plan.

8.4 Debate on the following 2019/2020 EFF motion:

**This House notes:**

That this very Legislature and some provincial departments still employ workers on contract;

That some staff members have been on contract for more than 10 years;

That most workers are supplied by labour brokers and tenderpreneurs who exploit them; and

That our people are turned into slaves through EPWP/CW.

**This House therefore resolves:**

To call on all departments to in-source workers with immediate effect, especially security guards, cleaners, general workers, EPWP workers and Zibambele workers;

To call for the total abolition of labour brokers and labour broking; and

To abolish contracts and absorb all contract workers.
