- according to the formula set out in section 2(2) of the Determination of Delegates (National Council of Provinces) Act, 1998 (Act No. 69 of 1998), the IFP is entitled to one (1) permanent delegate in the KwaZulu-Natal provincial delegation to the National Council of Provinces;
- Hon. X Ngwezi who was previously appointed as the IFP permanent delegate to the NCOP has resigned;
- the IFP has nominated Mr Nhlanhla Hadebe as the new IFP permanent delegate to the NCOP and this nomination was received by the Speaker on Wednesday the 9th February 2022;
- in terms of the National Council of Provinces (Permanent Delegates Vacancies) Act,
 (No 17 of 1997), the Legislature is required to appoint a new permanent delegate within
 14 days of the date on which the nomination is received by the Speaker.
