3.5 REMINDER TO MEMBERS TO EMAIL OR LEAVE THEIR SPEECHES OF DEBATE WITH THE STAFF AT THE TABLE

Honourable Members, it is vital that all Members who take part in debates email electronic copies of their speeches to Hansard after delivery. At times the quality of the audio during debates presents a challenge, and this is usually due to connectivity problems. If Hansard transcribers are unable to hear what a Member says during a speech, that part of a Member's speech is recorded as [Inaudible] or [Indistinct] and is therefore lost to posterity. That is why it is important for Members to send electronic copies of their speeches to Hansard so that transcribers may be assisted to produce a true record of proceedings in the House.

If Members experience connectivity problems and are unable to deliver their speeches themselves, another Member or Whip of their party must deliver the speech on their behalf so that it is on record, otherwise it will not appear in Hansard at all. As Hansard is a verbatim (i.e. word for word) record of speeches in the House, language practitioners may not insert written speeches that were not delivered in the House into the official record as such a practice would prevent other Members from responding

or even objecting to what a Member has said in his/her speech. It would also rob Members of the opportunity of raising points of order if such a speech contains anything that is contentious.

Hon members, that is why we have consistently requested Whips to ensure that their party members who are scheduled to speak during debates, email their speeches to Mr Allan Parrott (Control Editor: Hansard & Language Services: English) at parrotta@kznleg.gov.za. Alternatively, speeches may be sent to Ms Jacqueline Stone (Manager: Hansard & Language Services: English) at stonej@kznleg.gov.za or Mr Mqondisi Ngcobo (Manager: Hansard & Language Services: IsiZulu) at ngcobom@kznleg.gov.za. We fully expect Whips and Members to co-operate with this request and thank them in advance for their consideration.
