has caused unforeseen challenges for Hansard because it was discovered that some Members who read out other Members' speeches also insert their own words into the original speeches. This practice should be disallowed, as a speech that has been added to by another Member can no longer be regarded as the speech of the original Member. A Member who reads out another Member's speech is not allowed to insert his/her own words or comments into that speech. A Member's speech should be read out as is, with no words added and no words deleted.
