Tuesday, 28 February 2022

The Hybrid House met at 10h05.

1. 10h06 Members were given an opportunity for silent prayers or meditation.
2. 10h07 The Speaker made announcements, including the passing away of the following persons:
 - 2.1 Ms Nkosikhona Mdlalose, Regional Chairperson of the Women's League, Abaqulusi Ward 12 Councillor and member of the Regional Executive Committee;
 - 2.2 Mr Mpendulo Khumalo who passed away in a car accident while travelling from NASREC after the

55th National Conference of the African National Congress;

- 2.3 Mr Cuthbert Nzuzza, a Senior Communication Officer and shop steward in the Office of the Premier;
- 2.4 Mr Mark Serfontein, State Law Advisor and Deputy Information Officer in the Office of the Premier;
- 2.5 Dr Frene Noshir Ginwala, human rights and gender activist, journalist, feminist, intellectual, former NEC member and first-ever female Speaker of Parliament in the history of South Africa;
- 2.6 Dr Elliot Ntombela, Ugu District (KZN South Coast) Municipality Manager;
- 2.7 Mr Jabulani R Zondi, Director: Labour Relations – Human Resources Component in the Department of Health;
- 2.8 Ms Phumlile Mthiyane, Ugu District Mayor and Member of the Provincial Task Team of the African National Congress Women’s League;
- 2.9 Mr John Moeti, a former professional footballer who played as a midfielder. He played club football for Orlando Pirates and SuperSport United;
- 2.10 Inkosi Zwelakhe Ndaba of Ntabamhlophe in Estcourt;
- 2.11 Dr Walter Bhekithemba Ngcobo, former CEO of the Moses Kotane Institute;
- 2.12 Mr Kiernan “AKA” Forbes, renowned rap music star;

- 2.13 Mr Tebello “Tibz” Motsoane, chef and author who was killed alongside Mr Kiernan “AKA” Forbes;
- 2.14 Sergeant Vusi Mabena, a SA National Defence Force soldier who was killed in the Democratic Republic of Congo when the Oryx helicopter he had been in came under fire in Goma;
- 2.15 Mr Bongani “Nombembe” Mkhize, induna yeButho leSilo;
- 2.16 Ms Angel Mchunu, former Regional Executive Committee member who also served in the Executive Committee of Umgungundlovu District Municipality;
- 2.17 Mr Peter Jones, a struggle stalwart who was part of the establishment of the first branch of the Black People’s Convention in the Western Cape in the 1970s. He later served as Vice President of the Azanian People’s Organisation (Azapo) and was arrested with Bantu Stephen Biko in 1977 before the apartheid police murdered Biko;
- 2.18 Her Royal Highness Princess Alice, the daughter of King Solomon kaDinuzulu;
- 2.19 Mr Siphon “Judah” Mthethwa, Chairperson of the organisation, uMhlabuyalingana Society Against Crime, in Northern KwaZulu-Natal. Mr Mthethwa was at the forefront in the fight against cross-border crime in areas around uMkhanyakude. These crimes involved the theft of motor vehicles which were taken across the border to Mozambique.
- 2.20 Mr Rafiq Rohan, renowned journalist and former South African political prisoner on Robben Island. He was jailed alongside Nelson Mandela and was the last prisoner to occupy Mandela’s old cell on

Robben Island. Mr Rohan dedicated his life to the struggle for liberation in South Africa
