2. OBITUARIES (Item 2 on the Order Paper)

Honourable members, since the previous sitting, the Office of the Speaker has learnt of the passing away of the following persons:

- 2.1 Mr ET Vezi, a former member of the Legislature who also served as the Chief Whip of the Majority Party in the

Legislature between 1994 and 2004. Mr Vezi was laid to rest in Harding last month;

- 2.2 Mr Mloni Mkhize, brother of the honourable Ms PP Harricks, who was laid to rest on Saturday, 12 August 2023;
- 2.3 Mr Jabulani Thamsanqa Zama, a prominent businessman and founder of the popular Eyadini Lounge in Umlazi. Mr Zama was a visionary entrepreneur who had built a prime entertainment hub that helped put Umlazi on the global map. His popular *shisanyama* has given upcoming artists a platform to showcase their talents. The venue has also been a source of employment for hundreds of youths in Umlazi Township who work there in various capacities. Mr Zama became a role model for upcoming entrepreneurs who emulated his visionary business skills;
- 2.4 Mr Johaar Mosaval, legendary South African ballet dancer. Mr Mosaval was the first black South African to become a senior principal dancer at The Royal Ballet based in London. In March 2019, he received the Order of Ikhamanga in Gold, awarded by President Cyril Ramaphosa;
- 2.5 Ms Monica Sophie Xulu (aged 70) and Ms Zanele Mbuso (aged 60) who were reported missing on 9 August 2023 from eThembeni crèche in uMgababa where they had worked. On Friday, 18 August 2023, the Search and Rescue K9 Unit of the SA Police Service found the two buried in a shallow grave next to the daycare centre where they had been employed, with their hands tied and plastic bags over their heads;
- 2.6 Msunduzi Municipality Councillor Mabhungu Mkhize who passed away on Friday, 25 August 2023 after being gunned down in Imbali Unit 14, Pietermaritzburg, mere hours after holding community prayers for peace in that area;

- 2.7 At least 63 people who have perished after a fire broke out in a 5–storey building in the Johannesburg CBD in the early hours of this morning. It is expected that the number of fatalities may still increase as many more people have also been seriously injured in the fire;
- 2.8 All victims of gender-based violence, femicide and hate crimes;
- 2.9 All public servants and traditional leaders in KwaZulu-Natal and the country at large; and
- 2.10 All victims of road fatalities in our province during the recent past.

Although these people have departed from our midst, they will live on in the hearts of their loved ones.

Honourable members, let us now observe a moment of silence.

May their souls rest in eternal peace.

On Thursday, 29 June 2023, hon CM Shinga of the NFP moved as follows:

This House notes:

That there are 14 million unregistered young South Africans, as per the Independent Electoral Commission;

That the largest and most influential voting cohort in South Africa is the youth who are not willing to vote, perhaps because they feel deprived and unrepresented; and

That young people need to be encouraged to register and vote.

This House therefore resolves:

To call upon political parties and the Departments of Education, Co-operative Governance and Traditional Affairs, as well as Sport and Recreation to collaborate with the Legislature and the IEC on voter education outreach programmes which target the youth.

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
