Honourable members, since the previous sitting, the Office of the Speaker has learnt of the passing away of the following persons:

- 2.1 Dr Protas “Hlokohloko” Madlala, a respected political analyst who passed away on 01 September 2023. In addition to his work as a political analyst, Dr Madlala was

also a founding member of the South African National Civic Organization (SANCO) and the Congress of South African Trade Unions (COSATU). He was also a recipient of the Order of Luthuli, South Africa's highest civilian honour;

- 2.2 Mr Raymond Ackerman, founder of Pick n Pay retail chain, passed away on 06 September 2023. Mr Ackerman was a visionary entrepreneur, humanitarian and a great South African. In 2014 he was awarded the Presidential Award of the Order of the Baobab – Silver;
- 2.3 Prince Mangosuthu Buthelezi, the father of hon PATN Buthelezi who is a member of the Legislature. Prince Buthelezi was a Member of Parliament, a Traditional Prime Minister to the Zulu monarch and founder of Inkatha Freedom Party (IFP). He passed away on 09 September 2023 and was laid to rest on 16 September 2023.

The Prince of KwaPhindangene will be remembered for his role as a political leader in South Africa and a revered leader in the KwaZulu homeland. He was also a scholar and alumnus of one of the most highly revered institutions on the African continent, namely Fort Hare University.

- 2.4 Mr Important Mkhize, who served as a member of the KwaZulu-Natal Legislature during the Fifth Term, passed away on 10 September 2023.

Mr Mkhize served in various Legislature committees and was Chairperson of Portfolio Committee on Human Settlements. At the time of his demise, he was Chairperson of the Luthuli Museum. He was renowned in the trade union movement and was a former leader of Saccawu during the apartheid era. He will be fondly remembered as one of the stalwarts who played a key role in the attainment of freedom that we enjoy in South Africa today;

- 2.5 Mr Thabani Christopher Sithole, father of Ms Sindi Mshengu, Manager in the Office of the Chief Whip;
- 2.6 Mr Mzwandile “Nganono” Shandu, Councillor in Ward 7 under Mkhambathini Local Municipality;
- 2.7 Ms Zoleka Mandela, the daughter of the late Zinzi Mandela and granddaughter of the late Winnie Nomzamo Madikizela-Mandela and the late Dr Nelson Rolihlahla Mandela. Ms Mandela, an author and activist on cancer awareness, substance abuse awareness and road safety awareness, lost her courageous battle against metastatic cancer on 25 September 2023;
- 2.8 Ms Anastacia Zindela, the grandmother of Ms Zama Zindela, a Special Projects Manager in the Office of the Speaker. Ms Zindela was a revered leader who played a critical role in the revival of the Roman Catholic Church in Izingolweni area on the South Coast.
- 2.9 Mr Erlo Stegen, the founder of KwaSizabantu Mission;
- 2.10 Mr Aziz Goolam Hoosein Pahad, South African politician and anti-apartheid activities, passed away at his home in Johannesburg yesterday, 27 September 2023. Mr Pahad was a former Deputy Minister of Foreign Affairs from 1994 to 2008. He was also a member of the National Executive Committee of the African National Congress from 1985 to 2007;

On Thursday, 15 September 2022, hon SE Mangle of the ACDP, moved as follows:

This House notes:

That we are alarmed by a recent report on the latest crime statistics in South Africa which revealed that KwaZulu-Natal is the country's most deadly province; and

That out of the 6 424 murder cases reported between April and June of 2022, an alarming number of 1 623 cases had occurred in KwaZulu-Natal.

To collect illegal firearms from individuals and affected communities to help push back rampant crime within our province.
